- A completed Child Abuse Register Search. <u>http://www.gov.ns.ca/coms/families/abuse/Chil</u> <u>d AbuseRegister.html</u>
- Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector. This can be obtained from your local RCMP detachment or My Backcheck https://www.mybackcheck.com/Public/Login.a spx

These checks need to be on file three months before the field trip day. Once we have them on file they are good for 3 years.

Gaelic Awareness Month


