Important Pick-Up Reminder for Parents who have students in the new modular

Important Reminder for School Volunteers: Required Background Checks

Thank you to all parents interested in volunteering and chaperoning! Your support is invaluable to our school, and we appreciate your willingness to contribute.

As a reminder, all prospective volunteers and field trip chaperones must have two mandatory background checks on file with the school before they can participate:

- 1. Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector (VSC)
- 2. Child Abuse Registry (CAR) Check

Please note the following requirements for submission:

- Submission Deadline: Checks must be submitted to the school office within three (3) months of their completion date.
- Validity Period: Once submitted, the checks are valid for three (3) years.

If you plan to volunteer this year or act as a chaperone, we encourage you to start this process now.

Unsure if your checks are current or on file? Please contact your student's teacher directly. They can confirm the status of your documentation.

As the weather begins to shift, we want to remind everyone to dress children for the season! Please ensure your child comes to school prepared for both indoor and outdoor play in the current conditions. Additionally, we ask that you send in a full, weather-appropriate change of clothing (socks, pants, shirt, and underwear) to keep at school. Bonjour families!

Each month, we'll explore a few fun facts about the French language and culture. The goal is to help families connect with what students are learning in class and maybe even pick up a few French words along the way!

Did you know?

- French is spoken on five continents and is an official language in 29 countries.
- There are over 320 million French speakers around the world!
- French is one of the official languages of the United Nations, the Olympics, and the European Union.
- Canada is the second-largest French-speaking country in the world, after France.
- About 30% of English words come from French! Words like restaurant, ballet, garage, chauffeur, and bouquet all have French roots.

French questions to try at home here are a few easy French phrases you can use with your child — don't worry if your pronunciation isn't perfect!

French	Pronunciation	English
Comment ça va?	koh-mahn sah vah	How are you?
Comment était ta journée?	koh-mahn ay-tay tah zhoor-nay	How was your day?
Qu'as-tu appris aujourd'hui?	kah tew ah-pree oh- zhoor-dwee	What did you learn today?

LEARNING MORE ABOUT THE STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND ENGAGEMENT POLICY

Learning more about the Student Attendance and Engagement Policy

Did you know? <u>The Student Attendance and Engagement Policy</u> guides our approach to attendance and is in place to support all students.

The policy states that regular, punctual attendance supports academic success, responsibility, and preparation for the future.

Ensuring regular attendance is a joint effort between students, families and schools. As a parent/guardian, you play an important role by monitoring attendance, communicating with the school when your child is absent, and supporting your child's regular attendance.

What Should You Know?

- Communication about absences
 - Schools will monitor attendance and lateness.
 - All absences must be communicated to the school, following the school's procedure.
 - If absenteeism or lateness reaches 10% of class time, the school will begin to engage more actively with the student and family.
 - If it goes beyond 15%, more targeted supports may be used (counselling, referrals, community supports).
- High school credit requirement
 - For Grades 10–12, students must attend at least 80% of class time to earn the credit.
 - o If more than 20% of class time is missed, and efforts to improve attendance haven't succeeded, the teacher may recommend "loss of credit." The principal makes the final decision.

What Can You Do?

- Monitor and encourage punctual, consistent attendance
- Maintain open communication with the school when absences or challenges arise
- Work with school staff to understand supports or accommodations for your child
- Be aware of the thresholds (10%, 15%) and possible consequences (intervention, loss of credit in high school)
- Remember: the policy allows flexibility. If your child has a legitimate reason for missing school (health, family issue, etc.), schools are encouraged to take a supportive approach.
